More of Saxonia's military was retiliared to build new merchant ships in the southern ports. Money was paid to Muestim and Danish merchants for surplus grain. # THE GRAND PRINCIPALITY OF WARSAW

Casil Boshnik, Great Prince of Warsaw

**DIPLOMACY: none** 

Two Warsaw armies headed southe east to reclaim the lost land of Kiev, lost in the past by Byzantine diplomatic pressure. This wouldn't be a problem now there was no Emperor to stop them this tirme. Jivan Halazar and a newly formed eite corp Of 15,000 cavalry and 15,000 infantry plus 13,500 regular auditaries made it to Kiev by the end of 1405. They assaulted the city in spring of 1406 and the fortress Hordgrad in the summer. No casualties were inflicted now Halazar had to wait for the other general Casil Boshnik with 59,000 cavalry so that together they could essay an invasion of Atelkuzo. Boshnik was, however, disloyal. After raiding, Ozu, he attacked I-talazar while shouting his intentions to overthrow Queen Kelsida. Halazar was a smart general and drove the superior numbered cavalry from Kiev but paid at heavy price doing that. Jivan was captured by Casil Boshnik who still having 47,000 knights marched on Warsaw, assaulted the city and deposed the Queers. The government suffered as Boshnik purged those who would not swear loyalty to him. He gained control of the entire country except for Halazar's army occupying Kiev. For that Halazar was executed and plans were made to put pressure on the rival army who has declared Boshnik a tyrant and is calling for a restoration of Queen Kelsida. The claim on Prussia was forfeit.

She was fertile, though, and produced three little monsters (For those of you living in Chicago, they are the varrioire, the frankenstein and the wolfman) for her grateful husband. Blubogikan withdrew his horde to Emba and did not protect Blubog territory on the Dihaj side of the Urais. Cim was completely enslaved by the time spring rolled in 1406. Santunu Sholalita II DIPLOMACY: none

The Santanu walkwed in their liberty.

# THE CHALUKYA KINGDOM OF BAIN AVASI

Chalukva Saivehesa

DIPLOMACY: Dravidia(a), Madurai(ea)

The mostly hidden Prince Pulake-sin found a wife in Dravidia. Konkan returned to cultivated. The devastation wrought by the Mongols a generation ago has almost been fully healed. A scaly lizard-man dropped a note at Saivehesa's mailbox and it warned, "The Sea Zones Conspire Against You!"

## THE SHAGUNGAEMPIRE

Dhruva Shagunga, Emperor of Konorak

DIPLOMACY: none

Dhruva wouldn't miss an opporturn itty staring him in the face. He took his little army (14,000 men armed with drumns, flutes and bells) and invaded Assam. # CRISIS IN INDONESIA (1385-1408+)

Burnese Civil War: A.sssam vs. Kwa, Vietnam Java War: Vietnama, Makassar vs. Java

The Burmese Civil War widened whera Shagunga invaded Assam, joining Vietnam and Kwain forces in the festival. Assama's set backs didn't kill them. The crafty Pyinmana consolidated his forces at Samatata, preparing to make a final stand.

The Java War intensified as desperation set in for both sides. Java fought for its survival. Makassar fought to protect their new found homes. In 1405, the Java army again tried an attack against Makassar across sets the Selat Strait into Sunda. By 1406, they made it ashore only to come across a supperior army. 21,500 elite cavalry, 12,500 mercenary infantry, 20,000 elite Makassar legionnaires, 4500 Makassar spearmen and 12,500 Vietnamese mercenaries. Long Joe Mo who led the last Java army was killed at Rangu Farms where battle was met. The Java force was wiped out. With all Javans removed from Sunda, Java warships (though Java commander Xhoi Bao was injured) along with local Makassar ships cleared the Selat Strait of the Java Navy and their leader 'King' Chahandrasam. At the end of 1406, Lampung was occupied. There had been no resistance. There would be no further resistance. So Srivijaya was occupied early in 1407. All other Java lands had repudiated the Aquarium to face a cruel, uncertain future. In 1408, Makassar troops pacified Jambi and their returned home.

## THE AQUARIUM OF JAVA

The Aquarium's long history ended after so much abuse by its enemies. At one point all the islands were under Java's control but no more. Atjeh, Bali, Barat, Johor, Medan, Mindanao, Moluccas, Perak, Sabah, Sarawak, Sulawesi and Timor have become neutral land.

## THE DAI VIET GUO

Triang, Wang Dai Viet DIPLOMACY: none

The Viet navy headed off from Tonkin's leafy shore in 1405, splitting in two in the Penunjuk Wan. One went inland to confront the Assamese occupation of Kwa. This was led by Quoi Udon, a veteran of the Java conflict. Quoi easily won Kwa as the Assamese fled like cowardly mongrels. In Kwa was built the port fortress facing the Penunjuk Wan intended for Vietnamese purposes in their final push against the Java Aquarium. Being injured in the battle of Rangu Farms, Xhoi Bao stayed in Lampung to heal his wounds (But the GM moved him to Phan Rang by the end of 1408).

#### THE HIDDEN DRAGON OF CHEKLANG

Quan Zinco, Celestial Emperor of Chekiang

DIPLOMACY: Kedah(nt)

The Emperor sent an expedition to Kedah to assert the Dragon's right to claim this outpost and use it to trade with India. Zhan Ju succeeded in this quest and came back with jade tokens. He reported that the planned port fortress was built upon the ruins of Tani. In the woods of Hunan, Jung Li ran into a red cowled man who fought without weapons. It turned out he wasn't that great a fighter and Jung Li beat him. The cowled man down and out, got up when Jung Li was looking away, and escaped into the woods. Then Jung Li discovered he was fatally poisoned and died on the spot. A new city Linchuan was built in Kanchou.
