Version 6: Lords 24 uses version 6 of the basic rules

The Map: The map now includes India as well as Europe, Central Asia and Africa. I've greyed out repeated areas on the maps to make my life easier. However, this means some player nations are split across more than one map. I may increase the size of the main map but I'll have to think on this.

Tithes and Tribute: I think these are automatically updated by the stats program, so no need to declare them in your orders.

Control of the Papacy and Religious Orders: In Lords 24 we will not always have a player Pope (or Caliph etc for that matter) and the following rules are used to determine which player faction controls the Pope's actions, Papacy Rules. I've also added some stuff about gaining support from their armies

The Atakapa Tribes

(Open Empire)

Nytah, Chief of the Atakapa



Old chief Nytah finally passed away in 1467 after a long a successful reign. His son, young Prince Katkosh was made chief and he took over his father's duties. Only the death of his beloved wife Nadua during childbirth soured the start of his rule.

The Ute

(Open Empire)

White Stag, Chief of the Ute



The war with the Sioux was temporarily forgotten as Chief White Stag was to die suddenly in 1466. His son, Prince Charging bear was declared Chief of the Ute. The great warrior Black Hawk was to return to Ute but never survived the journey after getting caught in winter storms crossing the mountains. The affairs of state were left in the hands of Ouray, who would rather spend his time hunting.

The Huron Confederacy

(Open Empire)

Nanasuwara, Chief of the Hurons



Trade was established with the Cree through the newly restored province of Ottawa. Chief Nanasuwara and his brother Nomino continued to oversee the Confederacy from Ossossane and were both blessed with children during these years. Before his death in 1467, Neguindah was able to gain tribute from the Wyandot tribes.

The Carib Tribes

(Open Empire)

Talin, Chief of the Carib

Chief Talin was assisted by Guacanagarix in ruling the Carib Tribes. He decided that the barren islands of Lucayo would no longer enjoy his rule and left them to go their own way. His wife, Queen Anacaona finally was to finally find relief from incessant childbirth when the very act caused her death during the stillbirth

The Yokut Tribes

(Open Empire)

Babbling Brook, Chief of the Yokuts

The city of Dolphin Cove grew in size and its extensive walls replaced. Queen Balling Brook was to oversee the Yokut people until her daughter Morning Dancer was old enough to marry. Keen eagle was dispatched to Salinan where an alliance was gained. He was assisted by Red Fox who completed the mission upon Dancer's death in 1468. West Wind was given command of the Yokut fleet and set out to explore the Santa Maria Sea from Dolphin Cove before

The Nootka Tribes

(Open Empire)

Ko-ishin-mit, Winged Peacemaker of the Nuu-chah-nulth



While Chief Ko-ishin-mit ruled from Nootka, more resources were sent to the lands of the Tolowa and the Tautin to clear back the wilderness. Iniiti spend these years with the young twin princes, Chulyen and Guguyni, teaching them the ways of the Nootka people.

The Chipewan

(Open Empire)

Dlezi, Chief of the Chipewan



Chief Dlezi once again ruled from Cheraweya. His wife, Queen Nadlari, finally provided him with a son after years of trying; maybe the threat of divorce was encouragement enough. Mjitsaghi encouraged the Saskatchewan to settle their lands before doing the same to the Cree. His attempts to explore Mikkwa were thwarted in 1469 by harsh storms that took his life.

The Cree

(Open Empire)

Mahihkan, Chief of the Cree



Chief Mahohkan continued to rule the Cree nation from Nameluni with Queen Nipisiy and was blessed with another son. Kahkewistahaw travelled west to the lands of the Chippewa where he laid claim to those lands for the Cree. In Nameluni, Ahtahkakoop was to claim the tribe in the name of the Maskegon.

The Echota

(Open Empire)

Taloo Sunkeeper, Chief of the Echota



More resources were sent to clear the lands of the Chatot, Creek and the Yuchi. Chief Sunkeeper ruled from Yanasee and was blessed with two children by Queen Henoa. Trade was established over the mountains with both the Chickasaw and Cherokee through the Echota province of Yuchi.

The Moundbuilders

(Open Empire)

Untamek, Chief of the Moundbuilders

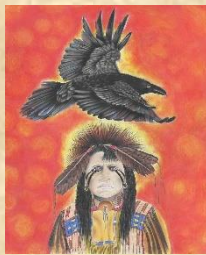


Untamek sent Prince Skythe to Eire to oversee affairs from that province. A young bride was found for the Prince amongst the Cherokee after he travelled south across the Ohio in 1469. Chief Untamek rule continued with Queen Kirin, assisted by the able Bloodmoon. Katar was to gain an alliance from the Sangamon tribes.

The Paiute

(Open Empire)

Numage, Chief of the Paiute

The Hohokam

(Noble House)

Hokolesqua, Chief of the Hohokam



Chief Hokolesqua continued to rule the Hohokam tribes from Salinan and was to take a bride from amongst his people. He sent his warriors back to the tribe as their services were no longer required. Mato was ordered to return to Salinan but failed to make it home after suffering a fall.

Missionaries from the Order were active in the Micmac lands of Abeneki where large numbers of converts were gained.

South America

The Chimu Kingdom of Chanchan

(Open Empire)

Illapa Puma, King of the Chimu



The road out of Chanchan was extended further north to the Guayami port of Chiriqui. It was to include a bridge over the Panama Canal through Cuna. Chief Puma added large number of warriors to his personal guard and continued to rule from Moche where Queen Arauru provided him with a son and heir. The Moon Cult was pushed back in Guayami when Chanchan missionaries gained many converts in the province. Taking six thousand men from Puma, General Titu Manco rooted out any Moon Cultist in Choco by force. His men quickly defeated the rabble defending their temples and restored worship of the Sun gods. Some say he was cursed by the Moon Cult as he checked on a meal in 1469 and died. Yaku Wayna attempted a more subtle approach in Cuna to remove any Moon cult presence but had little success. In Moquequa, Viracocha Cucha continued his diplomatic mission with the province.

Chichen Itze

(Open Empire)

Korat, Chief of the Chichen Itze



In Popoloca the city of Popolaya was to grow in size and its walls maintained. Vast resources were sent to Boruca by Kaloraya and Charaya to clear more wilderness in the southern province. Chief Korat was saddened by the death of queen Quoraya in 1466 following a complicated childbirth.

Zapotec Mitla

(Open Empire)

Monequiltia, Queen of the Zapotecs



The Zapotec kingdom was ruled by Queen Monequiltia from Mitla. She was to leave its defence in the hands of Prince Zaachila and General Chicaxoch. Mitzli travelled to the Triple Alliance lands of Culhua where she was to request an alliance. She was assisted by the charismatic Chicahua before her death in 1469.
